

Youth Suicide Prevention: Intervention Training for Medical and Primary Care Providers



Intervention + Safety Planning = Lives Saved

The Oregon Pediatric Society is offering this series of two, 1.5-hour virtual skills booster training sessions that focus on youth suicide intervention. The training includes an overview of concepts, tools, and office workflows; large-group case-based learning; peer sharing and safety planning. The first session uses case examples to guide participants through evaluation of lethality and feasibility of different scenarios and means of harm. The second session focuses deeply on one case example to engage participants in creating a safety plan to support a youth and their caregiver.

Learning Objectives

- Increased understanding of the importance of universal screening for suicide risk.
- Familiarization with the most common means of death by suicide and how to assess risk based on the feasibility and lethality of method.
- Improved comfort with using safety plans to intervene with youth experiencing thoughts of suicide.
